So-called "software obsolescence" occurs when the manufacturer of a device discontinues the support for software that is necessary to run the device properly. Often the actual hardware still works pretty well.



You can replace the operating system of your phone with a Free Software operating system. Choose among several Android-based Free Software operating systems so called "custom ROMs" or even install a complete GNU/Linux environment.

Every time we keep using our current phone instead of buying a new one we help avoid the production of new phones and the increase of e-waste.

Choose freedom

Select a Free Software operating system. This could be a full GNU/Linux system or an Android-based custom-ROM.



Take control

Flash your phone and install Free Software. Find help in Repair-Cafés, in Linux User Groups or in our workshops.



Discover apps

Use the repository from your GNU/ Linux system or the F-Droid app store and install Free Software apps only.



Avoid tracking

GNU/Linux developments are independent from Google. If you decide for a custom-ROM you can replace your Google libraries with MicroG.
